How to Include System Audio When Sharing Screen in Microsoft Teams

5. Start Sharing

- Select your preferred sharing option
- Click to confirm and start sharing
- Your screen content and system audio will now be shared with all meeting participants

Tips and Best Practices

Audio Quality

- Test your audio levels before important presentations
- Ensure your computer's volume is at an appropriate level
- Consider using headphones to prevent audio feedback

Content Selection

- When sharing videos, select the specific browser window or media player rather than your entire desktop for better performance
- Close unnecessary applications to improve sharing performance

Common Use Cases

- Sharing YouTube videos or other online content
- Playing audio recordings or music
- Demonstrating software with sound effects
- Presenting videos with narration or dialogue

Troubleshooting

If Participants Can't Hear Audio

- 1. Verify that "Include system audio" was checked before sharing
- 2. Stop sharing and restart with the audio option enabled
- 3. Check your computer's audio output settings
- 4. Ensure the content you're playing actually has audio

If Sharing Quality is Poor

- Close other applications to free up system resources
- Check your internet connection stability
- Consider lowering video quality if bandwidth is limited

Important Notes

- The "Include system audio" checkbox is easy to miss as it appears at the top of the sharing dialog
- You must enable this option **before** you start sharing you cannot add audio to an existing share session
- This feature works with any type of audio playing through your computer's speakers or headphones
